1. Divine Engravings

"In the beginning, the King made engravings in the supernal purity. A spark of blackness emerged in the sealed within the sealed, from the mystery of the Ayn Sof, a mist within matter, implanted in a ring, no white, no black, no red, no yellow, no color at all. When He measured with the standard of measure, He made colors to provide light. Within the spark, He engraved a design and created worlds, sanctified in holiness, formed in emptiness."
